Feedback

Overwhelmingly positive.

A concept that should be replicated.

Proof is in the numbers!

- 346 individuals took an evaluation:
- only 8 people gave it a low rating!...only 2.4%!
- 26 sessions averaged a 4 or better on a
 5.0 evaluation scale.
- Top 4 rated sessions were fine arts... they usually are left out.

Finances

\$62,470.27 was total cost.

Venue -- rental, food, A/V

Speaker

Printed materials

Partially offset with sponsors and ticket sales.

Partner district cost was \$86.86 per person.
