Do you find criminal background check results to be confusing? You are not alone – deciphering the Rosetta Stone might have been easier. Do you know that Child Abuse and Neglect reports do not always contain complete, accurate, and current information? Schools need to be alert to omissions and inconsistencies ("blips"). Have you ever hired someone only to discover (after they are under contract) that they have crime, misconduct, or other hidden events in their background that would have precluded employment – if only you had known earlier? It is not a good feeling – conducting more effective background checks can help prevent that. This session will identify the pitfalls in the current background check system, offer suggestions for reducing risk, and provide practical, real-life guidance about how to interpret and apply the results of a criminal background check. Participants will be encouraged to ask questions, share experiences, and interpret sample criminal background checks during the session.
