- Quality programming that is affordable
- Kindergarten readiness/transition
- Social Emotional Development
- Parent Interaction

Demographics

- Rural setting in Northeast Missouri
- 240 Children-6 weeks to Kindergarten eligibility
- 59% Require IEP for developmental delays
- 54% Free and Reduced Lunch
- All teachers are certified in Early Childhood and Early Childhood Special Education

Where Learning Takes Priority

Demographics

- Rural setting in Southeast Missouri
- 80 Children ages 3, 4, and 5
- 65% District Free and Reduced Lunch Status
- All teachers are certified in Early Childhood and/or Early Childhood Special Education
- 30% Require an IEP

Funding Sources

- Missouri Preschool Project
- Child Care Development Fund Grant
- ECSE Funds
- Scholarship
- Child Care Reimbursement
- A+ Tutors

Funding

- MPP Funds obligated for a specific purpose
- Title I Based on District allocation
- ECSE must follow federal guidelines when spending ECSE funds.
- Transportation Expenditures must be tracked separately

Braided Funding

Flexible in the use of existing funding sources.

 Coordination of funds requires a tracking of expenditures.

 A braided program can use any two sources of funding, including scholarships.
