





Senate Bill 603

- Established MOCAP (replacement for MOVIP)
- Requires districts to accept virtual course credit and pay for virtual courses through MOCAP
- Districts can refuse enrollment if they believe it to be the "best educational interest of the student"
- Districts must advertise virtual options to students
- Districts must establish enrollment process and appeal process

Current Senate Bill 603 Unknowns

- MOCAP vendor providers have not yet been identified
- Approved courses have not yet been identified for MOCAP
- Cost of MOCAP courses
- Enrollment time periods have not yet been established for MOCAP
- Teachers for MOCAP have not yet been identified

- DESE is in the process of securing courses for the MOCAP Catalog.
- There are no approved MOCAP courses yet.
- Local school districts and charter schools should connect with their preferred vendors directly to register students.
- Local school districts and charter schools may use their own preferred online provider as long as the curriculum aligns to the Missouri Learning Standards and meets statutory requirements.
- Parents may work with local school districts and charter schools to utilize the district or charter school's own online provider.
- Districts grant diplomas, so please ensure course selections meet local district graduation requirements.
- Please visit the Summer School Handbook to learn about virtual summer school.
- Please visit the Missouri **Graduation_Handbook** to view the minimum state requirements for graduation as of May 2018.
- Students taking more than two courses must have an individualized learning plan: Individual Career and Academic Plan
