Developing storylines

- Know your why
- Understand every aspect of the video before you pursue it
 - 5 W's + H
- Identify key figures that should be in the video
 - Staff, students, community partners, etc.
- If it's an interview, identify questions to ask key figures

Developing storylines

- Look for inspiration
- Envision the video
- Make note of everyone that will be interviewed and locations

Techniques

- How you hold your camera
- Settings
 - 24 frames per second vs 60 frames per second
 - Optical VR = ON
 - Movie Quality = High
 - Film in manual (my preference)
- Having a stable and steady stance, arms, and wrists

- <u>Lavalier Microphone (Clip-on Mic)</u> for mobile phone (for interviews)

 - VSCO (\$19.99/year for video color-grading editing features)
- Battery packs
- Stabilizer with Gimbal Mobile
