Importance of MSIP



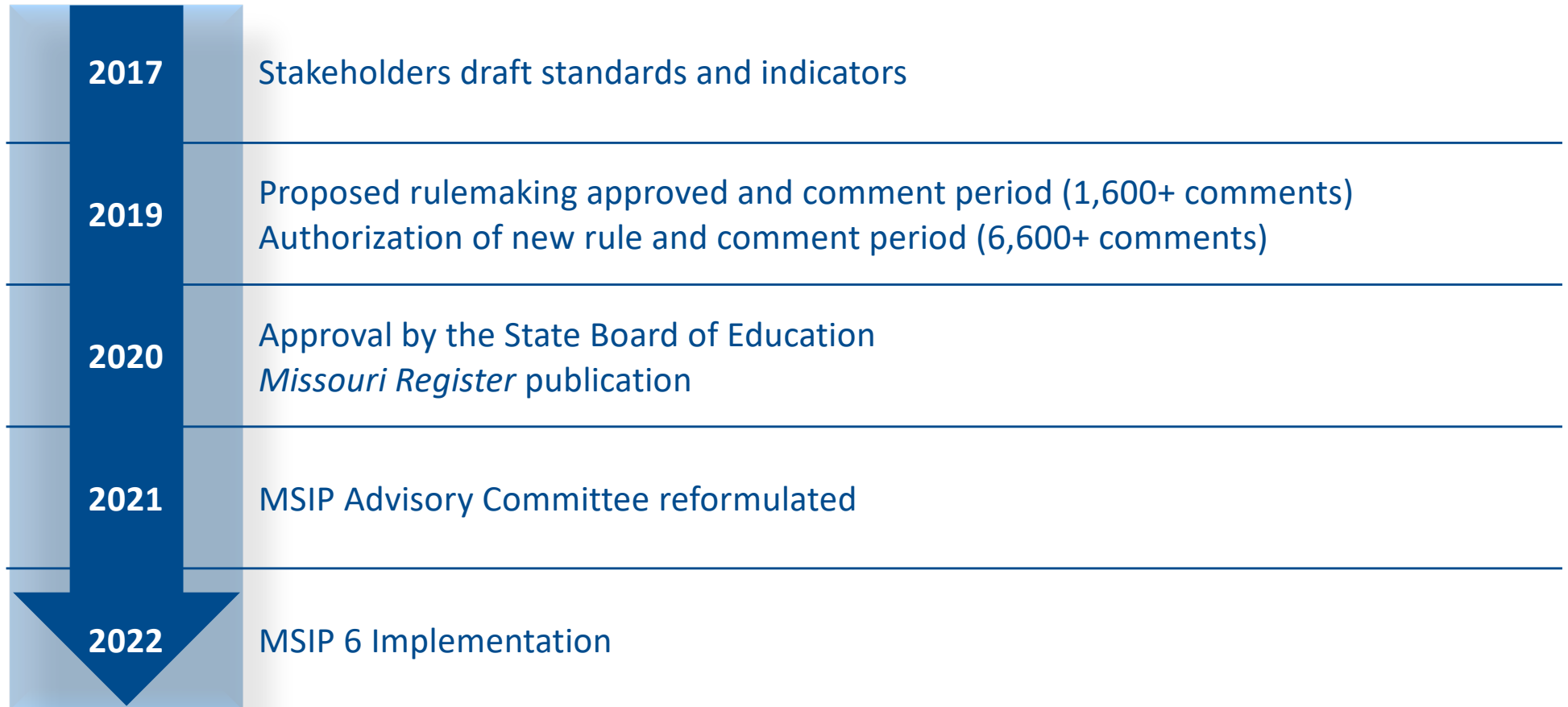
- Assure continuous improvement in all schools
- Promote practices that lead to healthy school systems
- Provide conditions essential to student learning
- Review and accredit the public school districts in Missouri as mandated by state law and the State Board of Education*

Stakeholder Engagement

- Standards and indicators were developed through a process involving over 150 individuals representing educators, business and industry, military, higher education, school board members, parents, and public officials.
- Metrics and reports were developed in consultation with the 34-member MSIP Advisory Committee, representing school districts, charter schools, and higher education.

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Implementation of MSIP 6



- 2021-22 is a transitional year.
 - ❑ Classification will not be lowered due to performance.*
 - ❑ Other accreditation requirements still apply.
 - ❑ Achievement status includes only one year of data.
 - ❑ Pilot districts participate in continuous improvement.
 - ❑ All data will be reported publicly.

Accreditation



Tier	Percentage of Points Earned
Accredited with Distinction	95% or greater
Accredited	70.0% - 94.9%
Provisionally Accredited	50.0% - 69.9%
Unaccredited	Less than 50%

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Improvement Plan Scoring



- Improvement Plan
 - ❑ Five categories with aligned standards and indicators each worth a maximum of 3 points (exemplary or effective)
 - ❑ An additional 3 points for completeness and response
- Response to Standards
 - ❑ A maximum of 4 points based on completeness and addressing the standard
- Climate and Culture
 - ❑ A maximum of 2 points for addressing four specifications as part of the climate and culture survey

Achievement Status Targets



- MSIP 5 targets set to align with “Top 10 by 20”
 - ❑ Revised most recently in 2019
 - ❑ No assessments in 2020
 - ❑ Assessment data not used in 2021
- MSIP 6 targets established by fall 2022

Achievement – MSIP 6 MPI



- Shift based on educator feedback from discrete levels and scoring to continuous
- Recognizes movement “within” achievement categories

Status and Growth



- LEAs demonstrate the standard for achievement in both status and growth/progress
- An LEA scoring “on track” in status and growth/progress will still be a strong scorer in the accreditation system

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EOC Testing



- Applies beginning in school year 2022-23
- If a student passes an EOC course, regardless of what grade they are in, they should take the test at that time
- Supplemental “guidance” document forthcoming from the DESE this spring



- 2022-23 begins the cycling of continuous improvement for all districts
 - ❑ All districts will participate in a three-year cycle
 - ❑ Districts participating will be notified at the beginning of the school year
